

## QGS CASA FELIX MYSTERY QUILT 2020

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An Option 2 selection

### FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

There are several options for selecting your colours for this quilt.

#### OPTION ONE: Totally scrappy

- You will need the equivalent of 2.1m\* of light fabrics.
- You will need the equivalent of 1.5m of medium toned fabrics. You may choose to grade your medium fabrics into dark medium, medium and light medium, but this is an option not a requirement. (See Option 2 for a suggestion as to fabric requirements for this variation.)
- You will need the equivalent of 1.75m of a contrast fabric – either brights or darks, depending on your fabric choices.

#### OPTION TWO: Scrappy with one constant

You may wish to use scrappy lights and mediums and have a constant bright/dark.

You could also use a constant light with scrappy mediums and scrappy brights/darks.

- You will need 1.5m medium fabric, or the equivalent of, in scraps.  
Should you wish to divide your mediums into three groups, you will need approximately 80cm dark mediums, 60cm medium and 40cm light mediums.
- You will need 1.75m bright/dark fabric, or the equivalent of, in scraps.
- You will need 2.1m\* light fabric, or the equivalent of, in scraps.

#### OPTION THREE: Three colour quilt

You may wish to use just 3 fabrics in this quilt – one being a ‘showcase’ fabric and the other two complimenting it.

Again, you will need a light (2.1m\*), medium (1.5m) and bright/dark (1.75m)

An example might be using an Asian fabric as your Bright/Dark fabric and using gold as your light and a third complimentary colour as your medium.

- I was able to cut my quilt out of 2m of light fabric, but there was little room for mistakes. A lot depends of the width of your fabric as it can vary from 39” to 42” It will also depend on whether or not you intend to use the TriRecs ruler or foundation piece one block.  
Foundation piecing takes a little more fabric.

The original aim for this mystery quilt was to shop from our stashes, and I hope that most of you will attempt to do so – but our shops need all the business they can get at the moment so don’t anguish over your selections, just go support your local quilt shop!
