

## Step Two – Part 1

*The following instructions are for the exact amount of units needed, if you have cut extras make these up at the same time.*

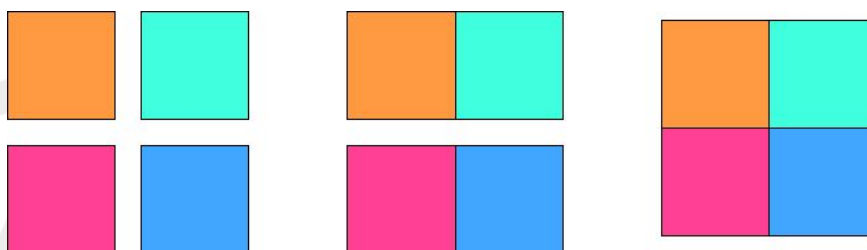
### Options One

### Option Two

1. With the remaining **sixty four** 3 ½" x 3 ½" squares, mixing up the colours and patterns sew together into pairs, then sew the pairs into four patch units. Press the first set of seams in opposite directions and then press the last seam either open or to one side. See video tutorial for a little tip on how to distribute the bulk of the seams in the centre.

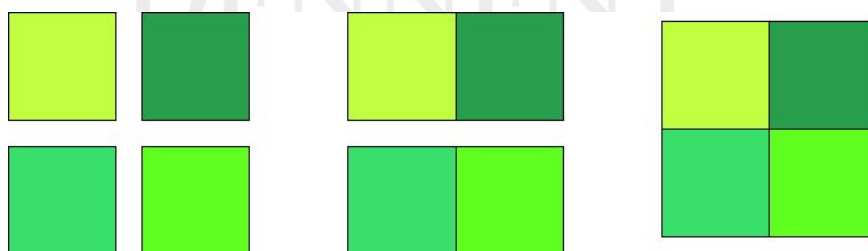
**Make 16 sets.**



### Option Three

1. Follow the same instructions as above using the **Sixty four Colour 1**, 3 ½" x 3 ½" squares mixing up the fabrics and patterns.

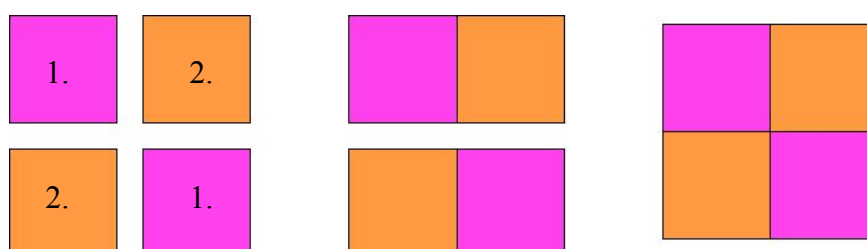
**Make 16 sets.**



### Option Four

1. Follow the same instructions as above using the **thirty two Colour 1 & thirty two Colour 2**, 3 ½" x 3 ½" squares.
2. Using the diagram as a guide place the colours in opposite diagonals to each other.

**Make 16 sets.**



## Step Two – Part 2

The following instructions are for the exact amount of units needed, if you have cut extras make these up at the same time.

### Half Square Triangles - Assembly instructions

I am giving you two different techniques to make your Half Square Triangles.

Technique A will work for

Options One

Option Two

and

Option Three

Use this technique if you want to mix up your fabrics and colours to give you more variety. \*\*\* Be aware you will be sewing bias edges so need to take more care when stitching together.

Technique B will work for all Fabric Options but will give you more repeats of the same fabric pairings.

### Technique A

1. Cut the **thirty two 8" x 8"** squares once across the diagonal to give you sixty four triangles. Diagram 1.
2. For fabric **Options One & Two** pair the triangles together mixing up the fabrics and colours to get as much variety in the pairings as you can. Diagram 2.
3. For **Option Three** pair the **Colour 1** triangles together and the **Colour 2** triangles together, mixing up the **patterns not the colours**.
4. Place the triangles right sides together lining up the raw edges, sew along the long side of the triangle with a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.
5. Press the triangles closed first to set the seam and then gently finger press open with the seams to one side, then carefully press with the iron. Take care not to get a pleat along the seam.

**Do not trim anything at this stage.**

**Make 32.**

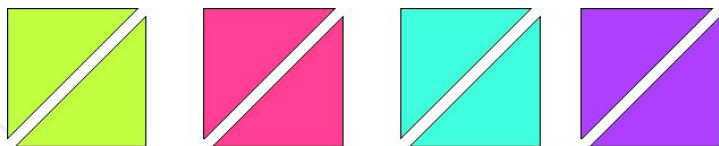
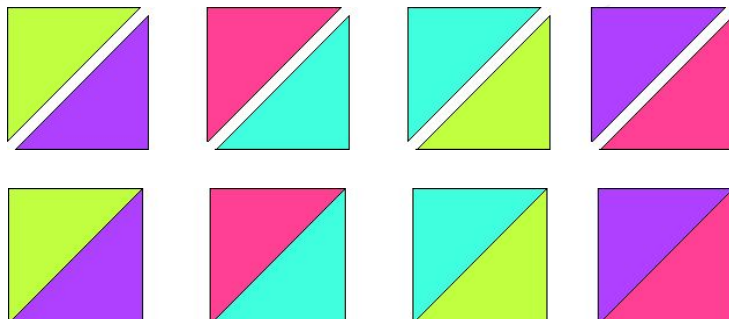
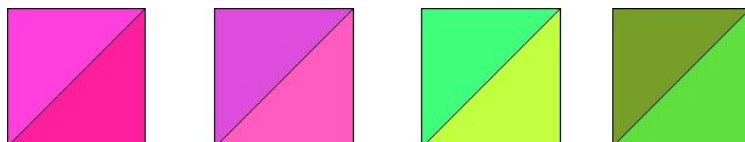

### Option Three

Pair your Colour 1's together then pair the Colour 2's together. You will end up with **16 sets of each colourway**.

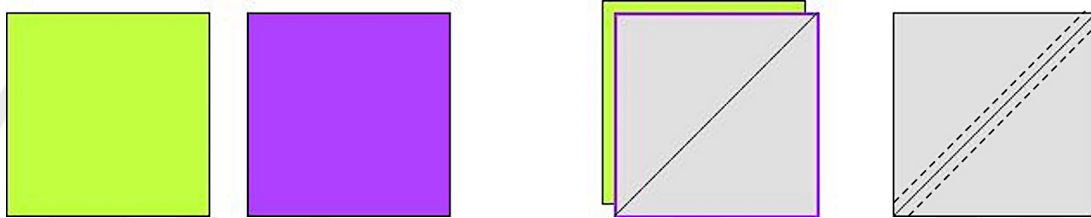
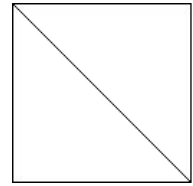


## Technique B

For specific Fabric Option details see instructions on the next page.

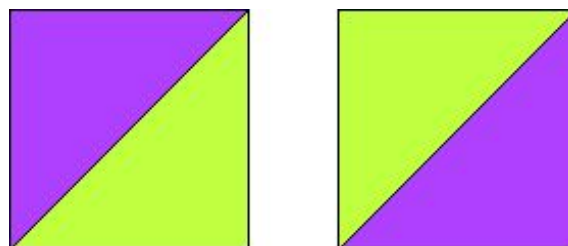
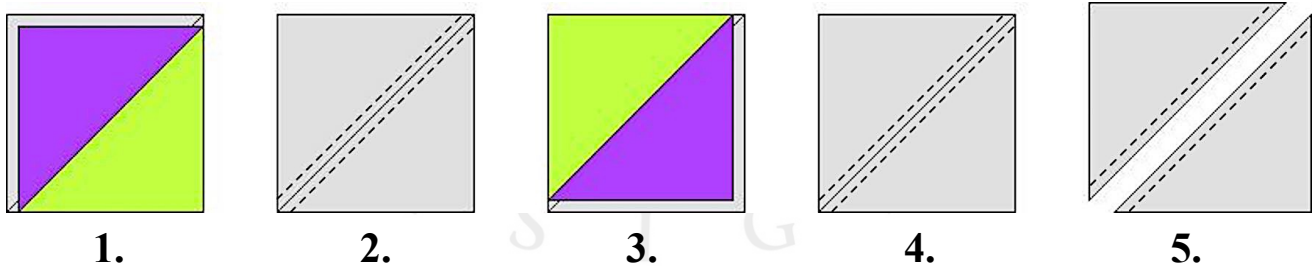
Thirty Two 8" x 8" squares

1. With a pencil or wash away marker, on the wrong side of **sixteen** 8" x 8" squares draw a fine line across one diagonal of the squares.
2. Pair two different 8" x 8" squares right sides together, sew on **both** sides of the drawn line a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance away from the line.



3. With this technique I like to press the triangles open before I cut, I find the triangles stay more stable and don't distort as the seams are pressed.
4. Use the diagram as a guide, place the fabric you want the seams pressed towards on the top, press flat to set the seams then press open one side (1), flip back (2) then press open the other side (3).
5. Flip the second side back (4), now cut along the drawn line (5) and re-press both sets again.

You will have **32 Half square triangles**  
**Do not trim at this stage.**

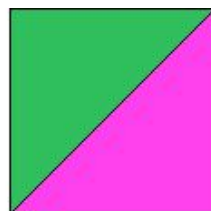
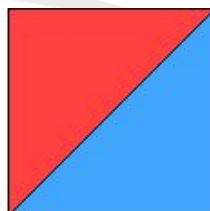
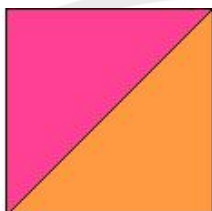
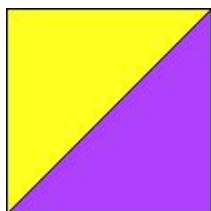
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### Option Two

#### Thirty Two 8" x 8" squares

Use either technique **A or B** mixing up your colours and patterns of your scrappy collection as much or as little as you want.

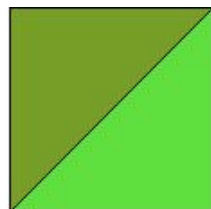
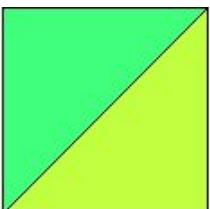
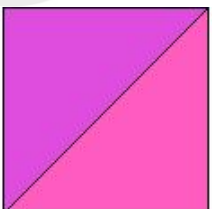
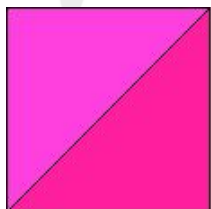
You will end up with 32 Half square triangles.



### Option Three

#### Sixteen Colour 1 & Sixteen Colour 2, 8" x 8" squares

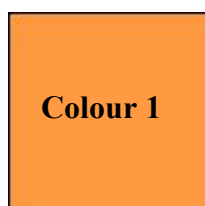
1. Use either technique **A or B** but you must keep your Colour 1's and Colour 2's **separate**.
2. Pair your Colour 1's together then pair the colour 2's together.  
You will end up with 16 sets of **each colourway**.  
32 Half Square triangles in total



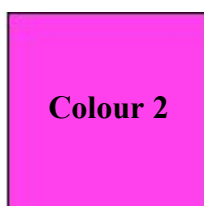
### Option Four

#### Sixteen Colour 1 & sixteen Colour 2, 8" x 8" squares,

1. Use technique **B** as you are only using two fabrics.
2. Pair a **Colour 1** square with a **Colour 2** square and follow the technique **B** instructions.  
You will end up with 32 Half square triangles



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
