

Pick-another-box !

This will give you the layout design. There are a number of different layouts for each block. 4 x 4 blocks for the larger quilt (60") and 3 x 3 blocks for the smaller quilt (45") plus a border or two if you like. Sometimes alternate rows begin and finish with a half block.

Once you have chosen the layout you wish to make, lay out the four units and check which way to press the last seam which was left un-pressed last week. The aim is have the least bulk where possible.

Check out the quilt designs for the blocks you have made. You can print off the lot or just the ones that are for the blocks you have made or just the one you wish to make.

You may like to layout the different designs for your block before sewing together in a final quilt. It is interesting to take photos of each layout as a record of what might have been!

You may wish to play with your blocks to create a layout design of your own, there are more possibilities and these five blocks are different to the blocks in Pick-a-box 1 from the 1990's.

You may like to add trams between the blocks. You've got plenty of time, so play before sewing together.
