



### 27 Miz Kelly with Irene Blanck – Mon 17

The vase block for Miz Kelly was an interpretation of an antique quilt. This class will teach you how to use your lightbox and therefore no need for templates!! You will focus on needleturn applique taught in a simple easy-to-understand way whilst having FUN in the process. Learn that needleturn applique need not be difficult – it should be relaxing and fun – and this class will prove that to you. You will glue all the pieces onto backgrounds. Your work will be prepared using a light box. Learn how to do needleturn points, to make multiple circles, make the block portable using glue and to choose, mix and match fabric in a confident manner.

### 28 Colour with Julie Haddrick - Mon 17

Understanding, using and appreciating COLOUR is a lifelong artistic challenge and that is what makes it such an exciting and important element to use in quilt making. Quilters can struggle with, or lack the experience or confidence with choosing and using colours so in this class each participant will make a fabric colour wheel quilt to hang and use in their sewing room.

It is a great resource to have and to understand how to use it. Students may wish to work further on this central colour wheel panel by adding borders or begin some colour samples using different colour schemes, tonal values, temperature and colour proportion using half square triangle blocks. Julie provides all of the fabric swatches for each student to cut segments (using a 30 degree wedge ruler) to make a 12 segment (36 colours with tints and shades) colour wheel. There is a \$20 materials fee for these swatches and the 'Theory of Colour' colour printed notes. Suitable for all skill levels.



### 29 The Woman with Pam Holland – Mon 17

She enhanced the embroidery in the original fabric as a feature and added a few 'extras'. It's just plain different and looks spectacular. Some basic machine sewing skills required.
