

### 7 Create and Use Screen Printed Fabric with Saffron Craig

In this inspiring workshop held over two days you will learn how to turn your screen-printed fabric into an art quilt or you are welcome to sew a bag or clothing. In this fun and inspiring workshop Saffron will teach you how to create

your own original colour palettes and colour combinations using special inks. This class is for the creatively curious and those prepared to experiment. Suitable for all skill levels. Beginners are encouraged. There is a complete kit available including aluminium screen and squeegee, plus one metre of white linen fabric and specialty inks at a cost of \$99.00.



### 8 Sock it to me with Pam Holland

Size: Wall Hanging - 80 cm x 60 cm (32" x 24")

There are so many different genres in quilting and this quilt is just one of those 'different' but fantastic ideas. Sock it to me is illustrative appliqué and you will learn to draw on fabric using the Tsukineko pens in a relaxed and fun class. You can use my pattern or you can draw your own pattern on the pre-existing sock outline. This technique will open up an entire new world to you because you are effectively dyeing your own fabric in a pattern orientation. The quilt is also machine quilted in an entirely different way, so if you want to go outside the boundaries, this is the class for you. Basic machine skills required.



### 9 Bowled Over with Ali George

Mon 17 / Tues 18

Size – Flexible - standard bowl/nest

This two day workshop involves recycling and repurposing materials that you already have at your disposal. Participants will learn to use threads, wool, fibres, scraps and textile pieces to create unique and unusual bowls or nests. This is also a great opportunity to use up threads, especially anything in the "what was I thinking?" category. Using your machine and cotton cord, participants will learn several ways to cover or wrap this cord to create sturdy

and functional bowls. Scraps of thread and silk pieces or trimmings will be converted to delicate nests that can be embellished to create small, stand-alone art objects. Fabric trimmings can be converted to cord along with twine, wool and other fibers to make interesting bowls or nests. There's lots of fun to be had creating something new and useful from "stuff" you mostly had!



### 10 Licorice Allsorts with Linda Haigh

Mon 17 / Tues 18

Size - 45" X 12" (115cm X 30 cm)

In Licorice Allsorts you will machine piece the back from a sandwich with wadding and backing, then quilt in a simple grid pattern. The applique is added to the top surface, with the stems made using bias bars, creating a raised look. All other applique pieces are made using a semi water soluble iron on applique paper and glue stick method. It's a quick and neat way to make needle turn applique. Alternatively your applique can be done with a tiny machine stitch – Linda will show you both methods for a neat and accurate finish. With simple quilting your runner is

completed. A kit is available with all fabrics for front, back & binding, plus one packet of water soluble iron on paper (not wadding) for \$70. Suitable for beginners to advanced.
