

23 *Japanese Pencil Case* with Sue Megaw

Mon 16

Size – 23 cm x 10 cm *or* 9" x 4" approximately

This pencil case is one of Sue's original designs based on a quilting technique seen when travelling in Japan. Use traditional Japanese or Modern fabrics to create a unique container to hold all your special pens and or quilting equipment. This is a great opportunity to use a range of coordinating fabrics in a small project. You will learn a

different way of quilting using running stitch and thick knitting yarn or cotton twine. Skills include straight sewing, sashiko stitching, working with bias, inserting a zipper and options for decorative zipper pulls. Pattern provided for matching needle case to complete the set. Some easy pre class preparation (with detailed instructions) is required to prepare the strata. This class is suitable for those who have some hand sewing and machining experience.



24 *Two Jam Rolls or Propeller Quilt* with Mary Rothe

Mon 16

Size – Two Jam Rolls: 143 cm square *or* 56" square

Propeller: 180 cm x 140 cm *or* 71" x 55"



Mary is offering a choice of designs in this one-day workshop – all using a Jelly Roll or raid your stash and cut 2 ½ inch strips X WOF. *Two Jam Rolls* can be created with or without sashing in between the blocks. Mary's advice is to use a good mixture of "good, bad and uglies"! This quilt can easily be enlarged if desired. The *Propeller Quilt*, here with reds and blues on a white background, is created with stripes for a fresh, fun



This would also be great with a dark background and brights or mixing up some Bali Batiks for a different look. Size can vary depending on your choice for setting the blocks and it is easily enlarged if required. Both designs can be readily accomplished by beginners to experienced quilters.



25 *Angle Tote Bag* with Leslie Edwards

Tues 17

Size – 46 cm wide x 51 cm tall x 10 cm deep *or*
18" wide x 20" tall x 4" deep

The *Angle Tote Bag* uses fat quarters and yardage of one base fabric colour. The bag has two large pockets inside to place all your sewing or knitting essentials and a large central space where you can stash quilt projects or knitting.

In the workshop you will learn basic tote bag construction, simple piecing and straight line quilting. Basic sewing skills and rotary cutting skills are required.

This workshop is suitable for all skill levels.

Kits are available using Kaffe Fassett fabrics with a base colour of pickle (as shown), orange or Mediterranean blue at a cost of \$60 (fusible batting not included).
