Kerry-Anne has done a magnificent job of the quilting and we sincerely thank her for her generosity. It was Kerry-Anne's wish that funds be raised for the Childhood Cancer Association.

The newest member of the Festival of Quilts
Committee is Helen Ingham and this year's
charity has a special significance for her. Helen's
granddaughter was diagnosed with
Neuroblastoma (a solid tumour of the adrenal gland

with a 50% chance of survival) at 2 years of age. Helen has experienced with her granddaughter and family all the hardships associated with the treatment of childhood cancer which took 18 months. It has been quite confronting seeing so many young children with this disease.

Edwina has benefited from the great support of the Childhood Cancer Association and was also the recipient of a quilt while in hospital. Helen is thrilled that her granddaughter is now 5 years cancer free, although not many people realise that current treatment of childhood cancer results in many

lifelong side effects, such as deafness and lung disease. Funding for new treatments being researched to specifically target the cancer cells only, will greatly improve cure rates and reduce long term side effects for these beautiful children.

Tickets are \$2 each and will be available at the next evening and day Guild meetings. So please make sure you buy some tickets to help this amazing charity.

Margaret Hurrell's Story

I am one of 5 siblings and Mum made all our clothes, so there was always something happening with the sewing machine or knitting needles. I followed in Mum's footsteps and was soon making clothes for myself, and then for my children when they came along.

Mum urged me to buy a sewing machine as soon as I got married so we did just that - a new Bernina was purchased while on our honeymoon! That was 1971, and I never looked back, as I had access to lots of free lessons with the purchase which boosted my confidence, and my husband greatly encouraged me to try making anything and everything.

My son started putting in requests for costumes at four years old (the first was a Father Christmas outfit) and the requests grew in complexity as he grew and became involved in theatre. I had no idea what I was doing but I'll give anything a go.

Moving forward to 2012 and I replaced my 1971 Bernina with a QE 440, and again it came with free lessons. This time the lessons involved a quilting project, and I was hooked. I attended weekly quilting classes for many years to glean as much knowledge as I could from my teachers and I hadn't realised how much there was to learn, a process which is ongoing, as every quilter knows.

Apart from quilting taking me on a continuous learning journey, I have met many lovely people over the years. Heather Ford introduced me to SA Quilters, which really opened my eyes and is now a big part of my life, and Heather and Peg Argent are responsible for my interest in that parallel world of charity quilting.

Apart from my mother being an excellent seamstress, I discovered after my paternal grandma died, that she was employed as a seamstress until she had children (I wish I had known that when she was still with us), and that my paternal great grandmother was awarded a medal for her sewing at the 1879 Sandhurst Industrial Exhibition. 143 years later her entry, a miniature man's shirt, hangs proudly on my wall at home.

So, the interest in sewing has run through both sides of my family and continues on with my daughter making her own clothes and producing many quilts from the age of 15, long before I caught the bug, and now my 8-year-old grand-daughter is showing a lot of interest.

I do love a challenge, and quilting has provided that in spades.





HEATHER'S TOOL TIPS

Heather talked about a By Annie awl which is useful for guiding fabric to keep together as you are sewing. That Purple Thang can also be used as a fabric guide. A point turner also has a groove for sewing on buttons that need a shank. There is a metal sewing guide with a movable piece to keep stitching even and a Clover finger press helps to flatten seams. There is a purple rotary cutter case which can fold in half to hold your cutter on your table, and a magnetic pin holder helps keep pins in a safe place when working on a project. 18


