MONTH TWO - BLOCK 8 - March

This block is called FLYING GEESE and is 4 " square finished. There are other ways to make flying geese blocks, I've repeated what we did in block 5. It wastes a bit of fabric but has less seams than making half square triangles, which is another option.

## Fabric requirements for this block

This block needs three fabrics, I chose the background and two other fabrics

- A is background
- $B$ is yellow spot
- C is dark pink spot



## Cutting

- A - background - cut $2 \times 27 / 8^{\text {th }}$ squares, cross cut corner to corner once $=4$ triangles
- B - yellow spot - cut $1 \times 5 \frac{11 / 2}{4}$ square, cross cut corner to corner twice, discard three of the triangles
- C - dark pink spot - cut $1 \times 51 / 4$ " square, cross cut corner to corner twice, discard three of the triangles


## Construction

- Lay the $A, B$ and $C$ triangles out as shown below

- Lay one long edge of $A$ along one short edge of $B$ right sides together and match the corners at the end of the long edge of B. The other point of A will extend beyond the top of B. Pin, stitch, press.

- Repeat with a second A triangle and the other short edge of B. Pin and stitch, press. This unit will be a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle

- Repeat with the remaining two A triangles and the C triangle, this unit will also be a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle.
- Join the units together as shown in the first photo. Finger press a fold in the middle of the long edge of $B$ (yellow) so you can match it exactly with the top of the $A / B$ flying geese unit

The block is now complete and will measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square and will be 4 " square finished
