




## Featured Quilter—Christine Baker

I had been a dressmaker, cross-stitcher and knitter for many years, but in 2012 suddenly became utterly obsessed with quilting. I attended my first Guild meeting that year, on a night when a large cheque was handed to Bedford as a result of Lessa and Faye's mystery quilt kits, and I decided right then that a) I had to buy one of the kits to support this work and b) this was an organisation that I wanted to be a part of.

I have tried as many different types and styles of piecing, applique and quilting as I could find, some of which have really pushed me out of my comfort zone. I get very enthusiastic when I see a beautiful quilt, either in the flesh or as an image, but unfortunately I seem to believe that having bought the kit, or the pattern and chosen the materials, that it doesn't take very long to make and I can go on to the next one – so I have a LOT of unfinished projects!

I do like making bags – something I can put to immediate use. Over the years I have made quite a few, so much so that when I put them all on the bed to photograph them, they more than covered the surface!

I have loved becoming part of the wonderful community of quilters and the extraordinary amount of charity work and looking after one another that occurs. I am of the firm belief that the best way to make good friends in a new town is not just to join an organisation, but to get on the committee.

My 'craft room' is not a room where the craft is done, it's more of a storage facility, while actual crafting occurs in my living room. It can get messy, but I live alone, it's fine!

I have a long-standing ambition to learn all of the crafts that take you from a plant or an animal, to a finished wardrobe of garments and accessories - including shoes! From a cotton plant or a sheep to a finished dress or jumper, from an alpaca to a dyed, crocheted hat or a pair of moccasins. Quilting has been a big piece of that journey for the last 12 years, and I am in awe of the talent and artistry exhibited by quilters all around me. Now if I could just finish some of these projects and clear some space...

## **SAQ's Community Quilts Programmes**

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING SAQ's COMMUNITY QUILTS PROGRAMMES

SA Quilters has had a Policy Statement for some time now with regards to what each of our Community Quilts programmes require. This is available on our website (https://www.saquilters.org.au/community-quilts/), has been previously published in I-Patch and Kathy has recently uploaded it onto some of our Facebook pages.

Our Quilts of Love programme is doing well in terms of this policy as the quilts Jill receives are completed ones. She most successfully adopts a 'Quilts In/Quilts Out' strategy.

Comfort Quilts and Flinders Kids have been less successful with the 'Quilts In/Quilts Out' strategy, with donations of unfinished quilts sometimes overwhelming us. In mid-July, for example, I had 50 unquilted quilt tops to quilt for Flinders Kids and around 30 panels needing borders and quilting. Some were quilt tops made by friends with whom I have an arrangement, but the majority find their way to me via donations from various sources. I'm working my way

through those tops with the help of Barb from Jack n Jayde Sewing Centre and I'm down to around 35. The Wednesday Sit and Sew group stepped up and took home the panels, which will start to come back soon and accelerate my 'to quilt' list again!

The issue with being given quilt tops is that the predominant financial burden for completing these quilts falls on the Comfort Quilts and Flinders Kids convenors to source batting and backing. Both of which are expensive, and we have limited funds with which to work.

Sadly, it's time to draw some lines in the sand, so here is an outline of where we go from here regarding donated quilt tops and donated fabrics. The most important issue will be the need to limit the size of quilt tops that we can receive. For decades Lessa's Bedford group have made quilts around 48-50" square and we need to move towards adopting this much more economical approach within Comfort Quilts. Flinders Kids quilts are now 40 x 48". 40" widths often allows us to use regular width fabrics for our backings. 48 - 50" width quilt tops inevitably mean that we need to be creative in making backings a suitable size, which takes time.

So what options will those of you who have larger quilt tops to donate now have? You'll be able to

- donate it to us along with suitable batting and backing,
- get it edge to edge quilted by a longarmer or yourself and then donate it, or
- move your quilt top on to a group that has the necessary resources to complete it. To pre-empt the next question no, we don't know who these groups might be!

In the past, several of our affiliated groups have successfully applied to their local council for a grant to cover batting and backing – the smallest grant I believe to be around \$700. So that is something that your group might like to consider applying for.

The other issue that I have, as Flinders Kids convenor, is managing the regular inflow of donated fabrics. I reached overwhelm stage about 2 months ago with around 10 x 50 litre tubs filling my garage. (Article cont. next page)

## SAQ's Community Quilts Programmes (Cont.)

Since then, thanks to Heather Ford and her electric Go Cutter, the After Dark Quilters, the Wednesday Sit and Sew Group and the Leadership Team I have reduced that considerably by having dozens of you cut fabric into a range of squares and tumbler shapes. Thousands of them. All of which the Marion Quilters and Stitchers in the Hills groups are happy to accept and slowly work their way through in making quilts.

The line in the sand here is that I will no longer accept children's fabric donations, so I need to be able to identify a couple of our affiliated groups who are willing to take in these fabrics to make up quilts. If your group would like to be the recipient of any donations of children's fabric please let me know who your contact person will be because my future response might need to be: Please take it to your nearest op shop.

Comfort Quilts are still happy to receive fabric, preferably in reasonable lengths, but please don't use this option as an opportunity to off-load your less than desirable fabrics. We try to always be mindful that the quilts that we give go to people experiencing challenges in their lives and our aim is to give them the nicest possible quilts.

Finally, with my President's hat on, I'd like to acknowledge the amazing and generous support that South Australian quilters provide to our three community quilts programmes. Thank you one and all.

## Recipe Corner—Pecan Slice



#### **INGREDIENTS:**

- 25 Jatz biscuits finely crushed
- 200gm pecan nuts chopped roughly
- 5 egg whites
- 1 cup caster sugar

#### **METHOD:**

- Whip egg whites to stiff peaks, add caster sugar slowly.
- Fold in pecan nuts and Jatz biscuits with egg whites and caster sugar.
- Spread evenly into base of baking dish lined with baking paper.
- Bake in fan forced oven at 130 degrees (Celsius) for one hour.
- Allow to cool.

Cut into squares then top with whipped thickened cream and grated chocolate. ENJOY

## **40th Anniversary of SA Quilters**

As we continue to celebrate 40 years of SA Quilters, we have trolled back through the archives and found an article from the first edition of the newsletter published in May 1984. This article was written by Jude Adams.

Why form a Quilters Guild? Can't we all just get on with making our quilts at home? Do we need a formal association? What role will the Guild play? In answer to the above, I believe that it is a basic need of people who have an interest in the same art/craft/skill, to meet together and share their common interest and to establish a bond with one another. The Quilters Guild can become a focus or forum to exchange skills, ideas, and experiences. As an organised group, we can achieve tasks that are impossible for individuals, for example we can arrange workshops or invite guest speakers (even from interstate or overseas!) with a particular quilting expertise.

Quilting, as a craft, occupies a unique position. Firstly it is an accessible medium, many people from all different situations and backgrounds can make quilts (eg the quilts from as widely differing places as Africa, America, Europe and Chile)

- as a bed-cover or clothing, quilts can be utilitarian, but as a wall-hanging their main purpose is as decoration or as a 'painting'
- a quilt can be made by many, or by one
- quiltmaking has traditional forms but can accommodate new directions
- materials can be costly or cost next to nothing!
- quilts can combine a diversity of sewing and design techniques
- a quilt can portray virtually anything you want it to say; it can convey a feeling, an idea, a realistic picture, it can be traditional or contemporary

I would hope that the Guild would see it's role as encouraging this wide range of activity, emphasising diversity rather than following a narrow path. Further goals I would like to see the Guild encourage are: firstly the development of an Australian tradition in quilting and quiltmaking and secondly the development of group and/or theme projects

......Community projects involve more people, both as audience and participants, than could normally have access to the particular art or craft. I believe that quiltmaking is particularly suited to this form of activity and I think it'd be exciting if the South Australian Quilters Guild was able to take the lead in this. Well, those are my hopes for the Quilters Guild. You may have other ideas

## **Workshops Report**

#### Bronwyn Cant - Filling in the Gaps - 2 days 3<sup>rd</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> August, 2024
