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## CLAYTON'S BIAS SQUARE DOUBLED - KAY

A scrap quilt using either one or multi background fabrics plus many scrap contrast squares.

## Requirements

36 x 6½" contrast squares 36 x 6" background squares 5½" strips for the borders

## Construction

2 x 6½" contrast squares 2 x 6" background squares

**Step 1**. With two contrast fabrics right sides together draw a diagonal line from corner to corner and sew a quarter inch each side of the line. Cut on the line. Trim to 6" makes 2 squares





**Step 2.** Place a background square on each of the contrast squares from step 1. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner, in the opposite direction from the contrast squares. Sew a quarter inch either side of the line. Cut on the line. Trim each to 5½". There are now 4 squares.






The layout for this quilt requires 72 blocks as above. For the design to flow into the border the borders will be cut 5½".

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Follow the layout below to arrange your blocks. Sew together 8 blocks by 8 blocks.

For the borders join two blocks together following the pattern and then measure and add border fabric either side.


Version 1 as in photo



If you prefer a balanced design make 8 blocks by 8 blocks beginning the design in the centre as shown in Version 2. Add borders without pieced blocks.

Version 2. For those who prefer symmetrical design. A border could be added to make a larger quilt. This quilt is 10 blocks wide by 10 blocks long.
