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CLAYTON'S BRICK WALL
approx. 49" x 52"

Background fabric 1.3m. I prefer to cut the strips parallel to the selvedge to eliminate the need for joins in the strips between the rows and the outside borders.

The quilt top requires 25 sets of 2 dark $8\frac{1}{2}"$ x $2\frac{1}{2}"$ rectangles and 2 x $6\frac{1}{2}"$ x $2\frac{1}{2}"$ rectangles and 25 light or contrast fabric $8\frac{1}{2}"$ x $2\frac{1}{2}"$ rectangles for the middle of the block. This will make 25 x 6" x 12" finished blocks.


Using the $8\frac{1}{2}"$ strips sew together dark, contrast/light and dark strip. See diagram.



Add a $6\frac{1}{2}"$ dark to each end as shown in the diagram.



Cut 4 of the rectangles in half as shown in the diagram.




Arrange the bricks three across using a half brick at alternate ends on alternate rows as show in the diagram. There will be half a brick over. Join bricks together with $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips.

Join rows together with $1\frac{1}{2}$ " background strips.

Add a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " border to both sides and top and bottom.
