CLAYTON'S SQUARES AND RAIL FENCE

50" square

A very quick and easy scrap quilt.

Requirements

Background


one fabric – 1.1 metre - cut 15 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips (wof) scrap_- cut 32 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 20" strips

Contrast

Solid or near solid for rail fence - 40cm Cut 5 x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips (wof)

25 assorted 6½" squares 16 assorted 4½" squares

Using 10 strips of background (or 20 scrap strips) and 5 strips of contrast sew together as in diagram. Background – contrast – background.




Cross cut into $4\frac{1}{2}$ " wide for 40 units $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

If when sewn together your pieces are not quite $6\frac{1}{2}$ " trim down your $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to match your rail fence. This makes it much easier to get a good flat finish.

Page 2.

It's time to decide where you would like the large and smaller squares. If possible lay them out with the rail fence blocks in between

Assemble quilt following the diagram below.



Use remaining 5 background strips (or 12 scrap strips) for border.
