Featured Quilter

My journey into the joy of creating with textiles - Patchwork and Quilting by Nola Pearce

I grew up on a cereal and sheep farm at Arno Bay on the eastern side of Eyre Peninsula.

My father had pioneered an area and as I was the eldest child I felt quite isolated for quite a few years. I enjoyed being at school and hated missing a day as school was my social life.

As a young child I was fascinated with colour and can remember dreaming of creating costumes in the only medium I knew then – crepe paper.

I learnt to knit, crochet and embroider during early primary school years. In high school I learnt dressmaking and made most of my clothes for decades. I made my own wedding gown at 18 years of age, and made wedding gowns for my sister, two daughters and one niece. I still enjoy making my own tailored jackets.



I taught myself patchwork and hand quilting from the very few books available in the 1970s and early 1980s, striving for perfection in piecing. Each shape had to be drafted and cut using cardboard templates (from weetbix or cornflake packets) adding seam allowances and cutting the fabric with scissors. Rotary mats, cutters and rulers have made for accuracy and speed. I started teaching patchwork in 1985.

Joining the Quilters Guild of S.A. in 1986 opened a new world for me. I joined the Exhibition sub-committee in 1989, followed by Workshops, Appraisal Panel (1992), President in 1993, Insurance Liaison Officer, Judging Panel and President again in 2010. I continue to serve on the Appraisal Panel. I have also attended many Quilt Encounters.

The privilege of serving the Quilters Guild (now S.A. Quilters) over 40 years has enriched my life beyond measure with the friendships made being the greatest.

Golden Harvest Quilters

Golden Harvest Quilters, based at Minlaton on Southern Yorke Peninsula, have continued their "Quilt for Others" program this year.

With the financial assistance of a Yorke Peninsula Council's community grant, in excess of 70 quilts have been completed and donated to other organisations. Locally these include Maitland Hospital, SYP Show Building Preservation, Yorketown Hospital Auxiliary, Friends of Palliative Care and Minlaton Traders Group. Further afield donations have been made to SA Quilters Flinders Kids, Green Leaves Early Learning Pink Ribbon event, Calvary Connery Centre, Ovarian Cancer SA Support and Uniting Country SA (Kadina). Some are gifted to clients and others are auctioned or used as raffle prizes. We also make Boomerang Bags utilising recycled fabrics; these are available free at the Pepper Tree Markets, Minlaton.

Most recently a quilt was donated to Charlotte Germein for her 'Paws for Celebration' dinner, a fund raiser for 'Seeing Differently', formally Royal Society for the Blind.

Members are busy preparing for their forthcoming biennial display. Titled 'A Stitch in Time', this will be held as part of Minlaton's 150 Jubilee celebrations 27-29 March 2026.





Appraisal Retreat Report

The SA Quilters Appraisal Team recently went to Mannum for their annual retreat. The retreats are so valuable, not only for the social aspects, or for the fun and joy of quilting and crafting, but also to share ideas and techniques.

We leave the retreat more knowledgeable, more experienced, inspired, not to mention energised and enthusiastic after a weekend away. Lots of laughs and also quiet times were had as we worked and crafted over the weekend.

Our group task was to time ourselves making a quilt top. Timing techniques and processes allows the team to add to resources and knowledge used to accurately assess the cost of replacing quilts. This time the chosen quilt pattern is called 'Just Can't Cut It' by All Washed Up. It's amazing how individual fabric choices give the same pattern a different style and look.

Thank you to our Team Leader Heather for not only organising the retreat but also challenging us and her endless patience when mentoring. The annual retreat is optional and not funded by SA Quilters; attendees pay for all expenses.



Guest Speaker, Jen Guest Physiotherapist and Senior Educator The Importance of Posture

We were delighted to have Jen Guest as our guest speaker for the June meeting. Jen has an extensive background in physiotherapy and Pilates and is the Director of Musculoskeletal Clinic Smart Health. Jen specialises in Dance Physiotherapy including an emphasis on injury management and prevention.

Jen gave a very interesting talk with lots of energy and animation to demonstrate some of the common issues that can occur when holding various postures for a long period. Jen spoke about common postures we hold in quilting which affects our muscles and joints, and over time can cause an injury or discomfort. One example was the "forward head poke". We may do this while we are machine or hand stitching. This forward motion with our head creates a heavy weight on our shoulders causing weaker anterior muscles, tight posterior neck muscles and possibly headaches.

Jen also gave other examples such as leaning over when we are cutting out fabric or pinning quilts which can cause issues with the lumbar spine and hips. So all the examples and tips were pertinent to help prevent injury so we can continue to enjoy our quilting passion for many years to come.

Jen was very generous and produced two programs outlining strength and stretch exercises. There are quite a number of exercises and Jen does not expect you to do all of them in one session. The number of exercises provided is to give you some variety and to enable you to do 2 or 3 of them every thirty minutes of sewing, quilting, cutting or sitting.

If you did not receive a copy of the handouts from the meeting, you can access these links and download and print them. I've started practising already! Remember your posture when performing various activities.

Winter Recipe - Meatloaf

Meatloaf

- 500 grams sausage meat
- 500 grams mince meat
- 1 cup of rolled oats
- 2 chopped onions
- 2 teaspoons curry powder
- 1 egg
- · Salt and pepper
- Half cup milk
- Half cup water



Mix and shape into loaf and place in casserole dish. (Makes two loaves).

Sauce

Combine following and bring to boil either in microwave or on cook top.

- Half cup water
- Half cup tomato sauce
- Quarter cup Worcestershire sauce
- 2 tablespoons vinegar
- Quarter cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon instant coffee
- 25 grams butter
- 2 teaspoons lemon juice

Pour over loaf. Bake in oven for one and half hours at 180 to 200 degrees.

Great hot with your favorite vegetables or cold with salad or in a sandwich.

Some of the feedback from this workshop included – Learnt lots of techniques and tips very helpful and knowledgeable; Intensive; Learnt new techniques working with colour seeing different shapes in material to make collage; Loved it but still lots of work to do; Quite a technical workshop but have been given lots of tips and hints to progress the project and finish it; Sue Knuckey is a wonderful tutor and always inspires me; Love, Love, Loved it; Fabulous so much fun, very addictive, wonderful teacher; Very good details given, lots of hands on help.

What is great about Workshops apart from learning something new it is also about enjoying the company of others as well as joining in and doing something we all love quilting. At the end of the day the Workshop Angels clean up and put everything back leaving the premises spick and span.
