- take as many UFO projects as you like



• at the end of the night take your UFO swap item/s home if it/they have not been taken

#### **Christmas Quilted Postcard**

Thank you to Monique for putting together the following hints about making a postcard.

Postcard's finished size is 4 inch x 6 inch. Like a quilt - your postcard has 3 layers, the designed front, middle layer of a thick interfacing/ stabiliser and the back for writing on.

Fabric postcards can be made out of scraps, selvages, or a whole piece of fabric, they can be designed as a picture or pieced or just random free motion quilting on your fabric.

The back can be plain fabric, calico or even white cardboard. You can write straight on the back with a fabric marker or print the back of your postcard on printable fabric. If you are going to make a lot of postcards you can buy an 4x6 ink stamp for the postcard template.

Anything goes for your unique 4x6 postable fabric artwork.

For inspiration you can Google "*Fabric Postcards*" and go to Images, look at Pintrest or YouTube. (There are lots and lots of videos on YouTube.)

The workshop planning started late in 2024 and we ended up with 18 participants. Helen and her husband Gavin, from Canberra, were travelling in their caravan as part of an Australian teaching tour. Education and inspiration is her aim and Eyre Peninsula was firmly on her itinerary.

We had to supply our fabric and wadding...that was it! We all contributed to our food and we had members who weren't doing the workshops and they prepared the meals throughout the day. Monday we enjoyed a meal at the local pub and Tuesday morning we preordered breakfast at the Pink Door café. We deserve to be very proud of our local businesses who supplied very delicious food.

Helen supplied the paints and fabric dye and we could use our own brushes and salt crystals to create the different effects. We had separate stations set up for painting and sewing, and used free machine quilting techniques that we'd been practising and lots of us finished this before we left for the day. Others are working on theirs and they're slowing getting done.

Yvonne brought and showed her large pieces of Helen's designs that she had completed and we were jealous of her efforts. The Great Barrier Reef, Frida Kahlo and a collection of nine little animals from one of Helen's Block of the Month programs.

The Burra Quilters BIANNUAL Exhibition attracted visitors from all States and Territories with a visitor attendance of 648 passing through the doors. Several quilt groups made the journey to Burra (including one from Victoria) especially to visit our exhibition and to take in the heritage of Burra. The gallery Visitors Book was filled with many compliments and encouraging words. We are fortunate to have the use of the Burra Regional Art Gallery where the lighting and hanging facilities allow our quilts to be shown to their full beauty.

Shock Horror was the reaction when two fat quarters were handed out as the base fabrics for our Exhibition Challenge, orange with red dots and a grey shadow play. The task was to make a table runner featuring these two fabrics and amazing runners were on display from traditional, modern and members own creations causing much discussion.

The raffle was won by Ann Simpson of Saddleworth, one of our member's sister, a Kaffe focused appliquéd queen size quilt, and the second prize featuring Indigenous prints went to Linda Wright from Wallaroo. Angel Flight, a voluntarily organisation which quietly supports country folk with medical flights and transfers, is the major recipient of \$3,000 proceeds from this project.





It's now back to our own projects and a wool felt workshop over two days is being planned for the later winter months, and Study Tour that will include a visit to the Maryborough (Victoria) Sewing Machine Museum along with visits to retail outlets is planned for October.
