All SA Quilters memberships are due to expire on 31 December 2025. For your members to be covered by the SA Quilters insurance, they must either be an individual financial member of SA Quilters, or an insurance payment should be paid by the group to SA Quilters on their behalf.

Your Group's insurance Certificate of Currency will be forwarded by email once payment has been received.

Your group could go on a bus trip to visit another exhibition or do a quilt shop hop. The grant could go towards helping to fund a tutor to run workshops or help towards the costs of going on retreat. Your group could host an event like Rural Roundup where you invite other groups to spend the day celebrating everything quilting or ask the Appraisals Team to come and Appraise quilts. If you would like more ideas feel free to contact me. Grant applications close on 1st April, so you have a little time to plan!
