I stamped down my anxiety and submitted my entry on the very last day right before entries closed. When I got to the festival I realised that I wasn't entering my quilt to win, but I was entering to contribute to a wide range of quilts for other people to be inspired by. Maybe someone will like the colours I've chosen. Maybe someone else will be inspired by the pattern I've used. Once I shifted my mindset, I become really comfortable with the fact that people could view my quilt and they were hanging alongside Chris and Zara's quilts. I even saw someone take a photo of my quilt! It made entering a quilt the following year a much easier process and I was one of the first to submit my entry rather than one of the last! Unfortunately I haven't sewn much over the past 12 months, so I have been unable to submit an entry in 2026, but I have started sewing again this week and hopefully I will have 2 entries for next year!

I wish all entrants to FoQ this year, a fun, inspiring festival, and don't forget to bring your non-quilty friends along to look at the quilts – you never know who's going to be inspired to take up this awesome hobby of ours.

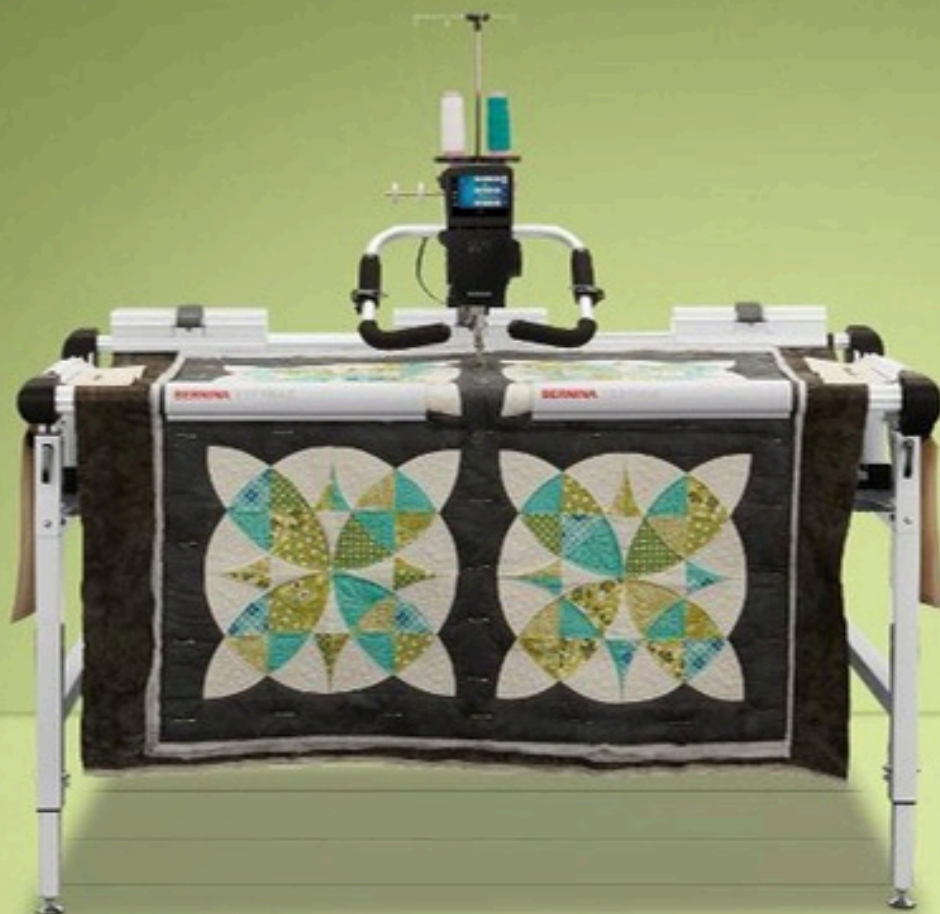

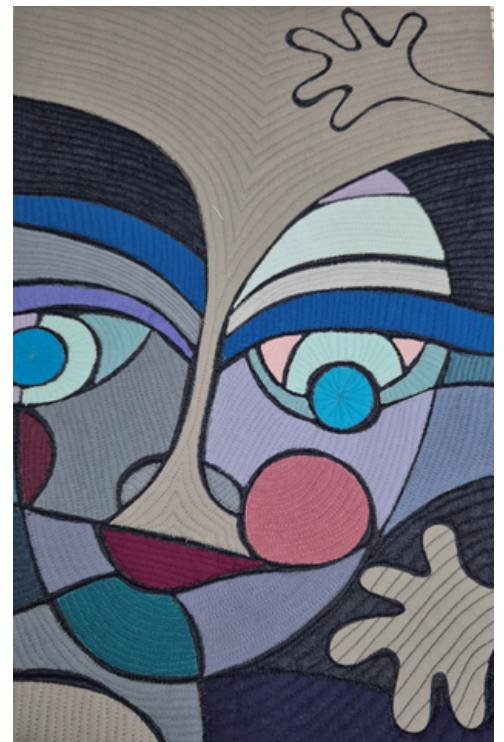


Come and See the Modern Mix Display - Picasso

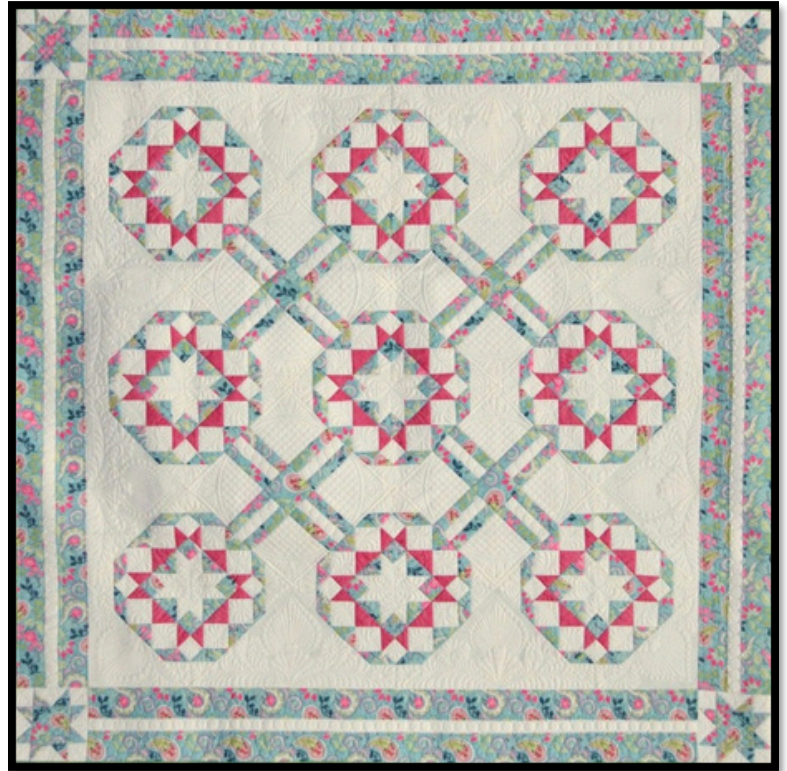

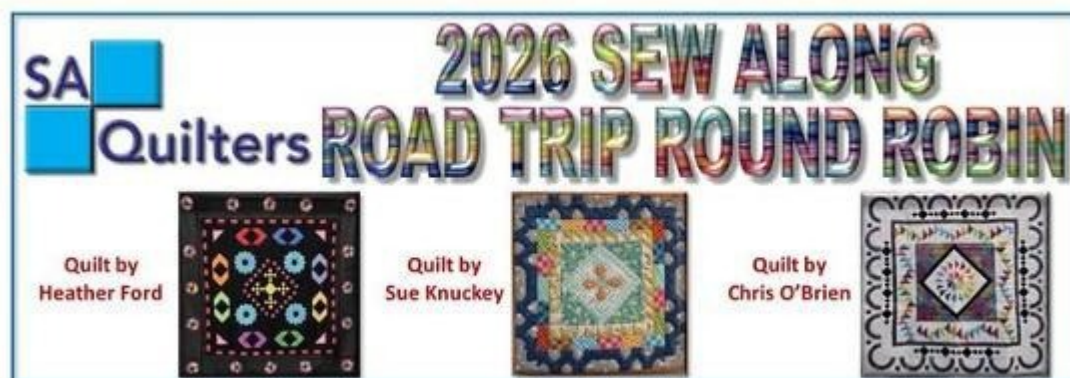


Show and Tell

Hello, my quilting friends. I first started quilting about 30 years ago when I joined the Coromandel Quilters, however, as I became mentally unwell, sewing went on the back burner for about 15 years. Three years ago, I joined SA Quilters with my friend Jan and slowly dragged myself out of my dark hole. I was nervous to begin with, but everyone at the Sit and Sew Group and at the workshops I attended were so friendly and seemed genuinely happy to see me each time.

We never know what goes on in people's lives or behind some of the masks we wear to protect ourselves. We also don't always know how our kind words and actions, words of encouragement, and the sharing creatively can impact another's life. They might seem small things to us but to someone who is struggling it can literally be the difference between life and death. This was true for me. My points don't always meet, my quilting is a bit wonky, and some of my colour choices are a little off but that's all ok as long as I'm learning, growing and most importantly, enjoying the process.

Looking forward to things was a totally foreign concept for me, but now, instead of making excuses to back out of things I look for ways to get to things earlier so I can get the most out of each situation. Last year I went to Missouri Star and Houston with Heather Ford and 25 others which provided me the opportunity to forge new friendships all the while personally committing to propping up the American economy one metre at a time. Keeping up with Heather was definitely a challenge and she really does know a shed load of stuff about quilting.

Every one of you are important to me, even those I haven't met yet. Thank you for the gifts of healing, friendship, and creativity you have shared with me. You will never truly know the full impact you have made.

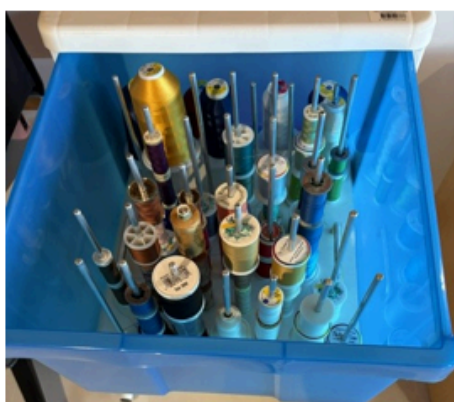

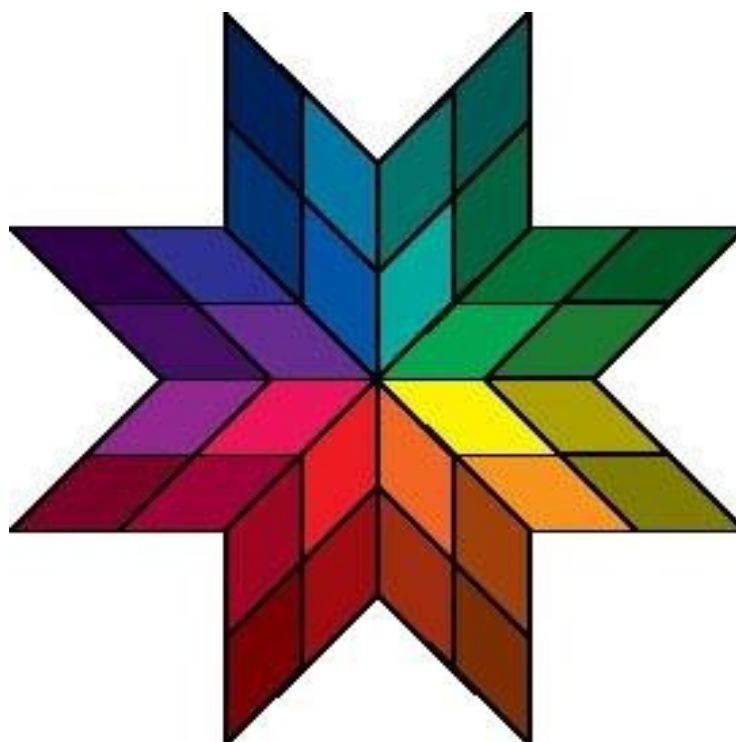
